


Tucson Musicians Museum Honoree

Music Director, Conductor


Born in Chicago, Dr. Herschel Kreloff played tuba, then trumpet, in high school. He received his bachelors and masters degrees from Arizona State University, played solo cornet in the university band, and principal trumpet in the Phoenix Symphony. Kreloff studied composition with Robert McBride at the University of Arizona and played in the Tucson Symphony, the Arizona Opera, and other groups. He also backed such artists as, Robert Goulet, Shirley Jones, and Sammy Davis Jr.

Dr. Kreloff completed his doctorate at the UofA in Music Education and Composition and taught instrumental and general music in Phoenix and Tucson. Several of his students succeeded him in the Phoenix Symphony.

Before taking the reins of the Civic Orchestra of Tucson in 1980, Dr. Kreloff conducted a chamber orchestra in Phoenix, and was an assistant conductor of the Tucson Symphony under Gregory Millar.

Dr. Kreloff's honors include: president of Kappa Kappa Psi, inductee into the Blue Key Honor Society, and recipient of the Four Way Test Award in recognition of "Service Above Self" given by the Rotary Club of Tucson, Arizona.
